Museum Facilities

The museum can accommodate up to 40 pupils per visit. Larger groups may be split in half to enable greater hands-on experience.

Teachers are welcome for a free familiarisation visit and to discuss your requirements - over some biscuits and a brew!

Workshops at the museum are provided in the Normanby Room. You may also use this space for lunch.

Workshops

Workshops are between 90-120 minutes long depending on the size of the group. Your booking includes visiting the permanent display galleries and a free quiz.

All workshops are hands-on experiences, utilising the museum's handling collection alongside discussion and creative activities.
